An entry fee of **\$2.00 per exhibit** is required for all horticulture and design classes entered in this.

#### **General Requirements & Criteria for Competition**

- 1. General rules apply to all divisions in this department. Please read carefully.
- 2. Exhibitors must take notice and observe carefully each show date, time changes, classified headings and all rules governing each class.
- 3. Amateur divisions are open only to residents of Illinois (unless specified otherwise) who grow plants through personal effort for pleasure and whose sales, if any, do not equal the outlay for seeds and plants. Members of commercial growers, employees, florist families, or anyone who has been employed by a commercial grower or florist within the past year is not eligible to enter. The arrangements must be the original work of the designer, but plant material need not be grown by the exhibitor.
- 4. Each exhibitor is limited to one entry per class in the Table and Arrangement sections. For all other classes, exhibitor may make up to four entries per class. Any entry is available for an award (ribbon); however, exhibitor will only receive the monetary award for their top placing in each class.
- 5. The exhibit must be constructed and entered by the exhibitor whose name is on the entry blank. All entries in the Horticulture, Christmas Tree, Specimen Rose, Gladiolus and Hosta divisions must be grown by the exhibitor. Only the exhibitor can and must arrange and place all his/her exhibit. Only exhibitors are allowed in the staging area.
- 6. An exhibit that has been awarded a ribbon in any previous class at the Illinois State Fair cannot be repeated.
- 7. In arrangements, choice of plant material (fresh-dried or fresh and dried) will be left to the discretion of the exhibitor unless otherwise stated, but plant material must be used. No artificial plant material may be used. Fresh material may not be painted. No cut food is permitted. No material on the Illinois conservation endangered list should be used. Slight embellishment (glitter, artificial snow, etc.) of plant material permitted in classes.
- 8. Background material will be permitted in all classes except pedestals unless otherwise stated. Backgrounds and staging may be incorporated into the design. Accessories and features permitted unless otherwise stated.
- 9. Exhibitors are required to list plant materials used in design on a separate card.
- 10. Entry tags are prepared for each class entry. These are mailed to exhibitors and should be attached the entries prior to staging. Entry tags will not be mailed after July 26, 2024. To receive tags after that date, please contact the Entry Department.
- 11. See individual divisions for staging and pick-up dates and times. Exhibitors should enter the fairgrounds through Gate 12. Exhibitors will be received at the south or west entrance of the Illinois Building.
- 12. Judging will follow standards developed by the National Garden Clubs or individual plant societies.

### Definitions

<u>Small Design</u> – An arrangement not to exceed 10 inches in any direction. Plant material should be in scale to design.

<u>Miniature Design</u> – An arrangement not to exceed 5 inches in any direction. Plant material should be in scale to design.

<u>Exhibition Table</u> – An exhibition table is not related to the actual service of food, exhibited in a triptych. The decorative unit should be in good scale and proportion to the exhibit space allowed. An exhibition table is composed of at least one place setting to include dishes, glassware, linen (place mat or cloth) and a decorative unit.

Tables – Tables shall contain service for four and a design.

<u>Buffet Tables</u> – The buffet table is informal in character and functional. At least one serving dish is required. Table shall contain service for four and a design.

Card Tables – Two place settings are required and a design. Exhibitor must furnish the table.

<u>Tray</u> – One place setting is required and a design. Exhibitor must furnish the tray.

#### Dimensions

<u>Niche</u> – lighted, 46" high by 31" wide by 22" deep, 4 feet from the floor. \*Limited to the first six entries. Standby list will be maintained by Superintendent.

<u>Pedestal</u> – 40" cube, 18" square top painted black. Pedestals may be laid horizontally with advanced permission of Superintendent.

Mantel - shelf 10" deep, 23" from top to shelf, 47" long, neutral color

<u>Triptych</u> – 36" tall, 29" wide with side wings attached. Exhibitors permitted to attach additional background not to exceed a total maximum height of 48".

Tables - 42" by 62"

#### **Specific Rules for Horticulture**

- 1. Specimen flowers are foliage that are exhibited for quality only. Exact number of stems or branches are essential.
- 2. All potted plants exhibited must have been in the hands of, and grown by, the exhibitor for at least three months.
- 3. Commercially grown flowers or plants will be disqualified, and exhibitor barred from further shows for five years.
- 4. When more than one stem, spray or stalk is specified, all specimens shall be identical.
- 5. Containers and wedges will be furnished.
- 6. No artificial coloring or florists' greens will be allowed.
- 7. All exhibits, excluding potted plants, become the property of the Fair and are disposed of at the discretion of the Superintendent.

- 2. Trees to be exhibited shall be within the 5 ft to 7 ft height range, measuring from the bottom of the handle to the top of the tip.
- 3. No trees may be exhibited with limbs or foliage added that did not grow naturally in place.
- 4. Trees may be naturally grown or sheared and shaped by the exhibitor.
- 5. An exhibitor may only enter one tree per class.
- 6. Entries must be delivered to the Illinois Building by 10:00 a.m., Friday, August 9, 2024. All Christmas trees must be set up by the exhibitor, in holder, and put in place on the floor. Exhibitors are permitted to furnish their own holders.
- 7. Trees will remain in place until 3:00 p.m. on Friday, August 16, 2024, and then disposed of by the Fair.

#### **ENTRIES CLOSE AUGUST 1, 2024**

If entry deadline falls on a Saturday or Sunday, entries must be postmarked by the following Monday.

Entry Fees are assessed on the basis of the Department as a whole. An entry fee of **\$25.00** is required for all exhibitors aged 18 or over. An entry fee of **\$10.00** is required for all exhibitors aged 17 and under.

Exhibitors may enter all classes within this department after paying the fees but must provide an entry blank clearly noting all classes they wish to enter.

#### **General Requirements & Criteria for Competition**

- 1. All rules from Department L Floriculture apply to this department unless otherwise stated.
- 2. All gladiolus exhibited must be grown by the exhibitor in all classes.
- 3. All entries must be classified and shown in accordance with the North American Gladiolus Council.
- 4. An exhibitor may make any number of entries in any division, but it is not permissible to make more than three entries of any one variety within the same division. Any entry is available for an award (ribbon); however, exhibitor will only receive the monetary award for the top placing earned in each class.
- 5. No entry may compete in more than one division except those chosen for a special award.
- 6. All one and three spike entries must be in place by 12:00 p.m., and five spikes, baskets and corsages must be in place by 12:30 p.m., on Saturday, August 10, 2024. Exhibits will remain in place until 5:00 p.m. on Sunday, August 11, 2024. Baskets and corsages may be picked up after that time. No flowers may be sold or given away. Disposition of the flowers shall be made by the Superintendent.
- 7. Each entry must have an exhibitor tag, which will be furnished by the Show Committee. Tags must be filled out in full with exhibitor's number, name, address, section, division and the variety name. Tags must be folded so that the identity of the exhibitor is concealed during judging.
- 8. Containers for blooms in all one and three spike classes will be furnished by the Show Committee. Containers for baskets and five spike entries must be provided by the exhibitor.
- 9. No more than three lower florets may be removed from specimen spikes without disqualification. However, such removal will be discounted by the judges. No florets will be removed by the judges.
- 10. Sports are to be handled in the same way as seedlings. One spike entries must be shown in Division F. Three spike entries may be shown in Division G or in open competition with names varieties of like color and size. Sports must show a definite color change to be considered for judging.
- 11. Stem length, measuring from the calyx, must not exceed 20" on 300-400 size varieties and 17" on 100-200 size varieties. To qualify for an award in the 300, 400 and 500 size divisions, all spikes must have at least 12 buds and at least 3 florets open at judging time. Spikes in 100 and 200 size division must have at least 9 buds and at least 2 open florets.
- 12. Seedlings allowed in Open, Amateur and Novice classes. However, Seedling Champion will only be awarded to champion in Seedling Class, Division F.
- 13. An entry obviously out of its proper division may be correctly placed by the judges at the direction of the Superintendent.
