### INFORMATION

#### Entries

Entry Fees \$1.00/head; \$2.00 for Market Pairs; \$3.00 for Market Pens. Entries in all classes shall be made through the online fair entry system at the Illinois State Fair website. Entries in all classes shall be made through the online fair entry system at the Illinois State Fair website. Payment must be made via credit card at the time of entry. No other type of entry will be accepted. Assistance with entries is available at the Competitive Events Office, Monday-Friday 8 a.m. to 4 p.m. All entries must be submitted online by 12 noon on July 15, 2024. Fees will not be refunded.

#### Show Schedule

The show will be held in the Open Air Pavilion (Building 105). Show order will begin with Market Eggs at 9:00 a.m. followed at 9:15 a.m. with Miscellaneous Market pair (Turkey Pair, Fryers, Roasters, and Grand and Reserve Market Poultry). Show order is subject to change. Exhibitors should watch and listen for announcements.

#### Department Rules

1. Each exhibitor must comply with the Illinois Exhibition Health Requirements; Animal Care, Drug, Testing and Welfare Policies; and General Rules of the Junior Livestock Division as previously stated.

*Special Note: The poultry exhibition health requirements do not apply to the Junior and Open Poultry Shows since they are one-day shows. Those requirements do not apply, however, if Open Show birds are staying overnight for the Junior Show.*

2. Junior Show exhibitors are reminded they must adhere to the Jr. Show registration requirements in order to exhibit in the Jr. Show and are encouraged to enter their birds in the Open Poultry Show. Junior Show registration does not fulfill Open Show requirements.
3. All birds entered must be of recognized APA and ABA breeds and each exhibitor may enter one (1) entry per class.
4. All Other Breed (AOB) classes are for birds in breeds not separately listed.
5. Do not enter Championship Classes.
6. Each exhibitor must be present to show their own birds unless exempted in advance by the Superintendent due to an identified, eligible conflict.
7. Poultry should be brought to the fairgrounds in appropriate coops. Fair management will provide a ring of exhibition pens in which exhibitors will place their birds for judging. Exhibitors are responsible for bringing their birds from coops to the judging pens as classes are called. Birds are not to be placed in State Fair pens unless directed by the Superintendent. Exhibitors showing in the Open Show prior to the Junior Show may overnight birds in pens assigned by the Superintendent.
8. The poultry shown must be the property of the exhibitor and a part of his/her project.

9. Any bird exhibiting signs of poor health and condition, or a pronounced defect or abnormality will be ineligible to show and receive premiums at the discretion of the Superintendent.

### **Special Definitions and Conditions**

Cockerel: A male bird under one (1) year of age

Pullet: A female bird under one (1) year of age

Miscellaneous Breeding Poultry: Includes Geese, Guinea, Pheasants, Peafowl, Quail or Turkeys hatched in the current year.

Market Pens or Pairs: Must be of the same variety and sex.

Fryer Market Pen: Shall consist of three (3) cockerels or pullets and the weight of each bird shall be five (5) pounds and under. Birds must be white feathered. Slight color tinges or sparse solid non-white feathers will be allowed.

Roaster Market Pen: Shall consist of three (3) cockerels or pullets and the weight of each bird shall be over five (5) pounds and under eight (8) pounds. Birds must be white feathered. Slight color tinges or sparse solid non-white feathers will be allowed.

Turkey Market Pen: Shall consist of two (2) birds of the same sex and color.

Miscellaneous Market Poultry: Shall consist of a pair of ducks, geese or guinea of the same sex, breed, and color, hatched in the current year.

Market Eggs: Shall consist of one (1) dozen eggs. Exhibitor name and number must be on the egg carton. No refrigeration of eggs.

### **Special Awards**

Grand and Reserve Grand Champion Poultry Male and Female: A plaque will be given by the Illinois State Fair to the exhibitors of the Grand and Reserve Grand Champion Poultry Male and Female of the Junior Poultry Show at the 2024 Illinois State Fair.

Grand Champion Market Meat Pen: A plaque will be given by the Illinois State Fair to the exhibitor of the Grand Champion Market Meat Pen of the 2024 Illinois State Fair Junior Poultry Show. Additionally, the Grand Champion Junior Show Poultry Market Meat Pen will sell at the livestock auction of the 2024 Governor's Sale of Champions.

Supreme Poultry Showman: A plaque will be given by the Illinois State Fair to the Supreme Poultry Showman of the 2024 Illinois State Fair. Additionally, the Supreme Poultry Showman will receive a monetary award of \$50.00 and his/her name will be added to the plaque displayed at the State Fair. The Reserve Supreme Showman will receive a monetary award of \$20.00.

## Poultry Showmanship

### Showmanship Rules

1. To be eligible to compete in Poultry Showmanship exhibitors must have shown birds in either Division 1 or Division 2 of the 2024 Junior Poultry Show.
2. To enter Showmanship exhibitors must sign up the morning of the Junior Poultry Show as directed by the Superintendent. No entry fees are required.
3. Age breaks for classes will be determined and posted before the start of the Showmanship Division competition.
4. The Showmanship class will be judged by the following criteria:
  - a. Dress attire
  - b. Knowledge of poultry and industry
  - c. Courtesy to others throughout the day
  - d. Attitude/interest shown for project.
  - e. Punctuality in bringing exhibits to classes.
  - f. Presentation of birds at judging
  - g. Care of birds
5. Supreme Showmanship winners will not be eligible for future Illinois State Fair Junior Show Showmanship Competition.
6. Showmanship will be held immediately following Breeding Class Grand and Reserve Grand Champion selection.
7. Supreme Showman and Reserve Supreme Showman may be chosen from any age group division at the discretion of the Judge. If a younger exhibitor wishes to be moved into the Senior Showman age group after the age breaks are listed, he/she may ask the Superintendent for approval.
8. Once an individual has won the Junior Showman age class, they will only be eligible to compete in the Senior Showman age class the following year.
