Entries

Required fees include \$20.00/head (entry fee) and \$10.00/head (manure). Entries in all classes shall be made through the online fair entry system at the Illinois State Fair website. Payment must be made via credit card at the time of entry. No other type of entry will be accepted. Assistance with entries is available at the Competitive Events Office, Monday-Friday 8 a.m. to 4 p.m. All entries must be submitted online on or before July 15, 2025. Fees will not be refunded.

Notice to Exhibitors

Beginning in 2025, Individual identification of each animal shall be by a USDA official animal identification number ear tag, ("840" tag), and the tag must be able to be read both visually and electronically.

All exhibitors must check in with the Superintendent for stall assignments before unloading. Further, only one vehicle per stalling group will be allowed to unload and load on the street between Brick Barn Series 18 and 25 on the South, and Brick Barn Series 25 and 36 Barn Series on the North.

**Note – Dairy Cattle Exhibitors will not be paid for milk produced on the fairgrounds. Milk will be hauled away as fluid waste with no milk samples or records collected.

Department Rules

- 1. Each exhibitor must comply with the Illinois Exhibition Health Requirements; Animal Care, Drug, Testing and Welfare Policies; and General Rules of the Junior Livestock Division.
- 2. An rRTPCR test for Influenza A virus (IAV) on milk from lactating dairy cattle exhibiting at the Illinois State Fair shall be conducted prior to livestock arriving on the fairgrounds. The animals must be sampled no more than seven (7) days prior to the date of arrival and a negative test record must be presented to Department staff.
- 3. Each exhibitor must be present to show their own animals unless exempted in advance by the Superintendent due to an identified, eligible conflict.
- 4. Exhibitors may stall animals in the Open or Junior Dairy Barns.
- 5. Junior and Open Show registration and ring card distribution will be conducted simultaneously in stalls.
- 6. Animals must be purebred and recorded in their respective National Breed Herd Book.
- 7. Animals shown in the Junior Dairy Cattle Show may be owned or leased. If owned, registration must show ownership of the animals in the name of the exhibitor or ownership by immediate family members including the exhibitor for the period required in the 4-H or FFA projects. If leased, registration may be in the name of the owner, but the exhibitor must provide a copy of the lease agreement in which the exhibitor is identified as the lessee, and the lease must be properly signed by both owner and lessee. Certificates from breed association representatives will not be accepted in lieu of registration papers.
- 8. The date shown on the registration papers will be taken as the effective date of ownership and the date on the lease agreement will be taken as the effective date of possession if animals are leased.
- 9. Entries in the dairy classes (either owned or leased) must have been owned or in the possession of the exhibitor and part of his/her project by June 1, 2025.
- 10. Exhibitors are allowed open substitution across class numbers in the dairy show. All substitutions must be made at the time of check-in.
- 11. Entries in the cow classes may or may not be in milk; however, all animals in milk must show in cow classes.
- 12. Each exhibitor is required to pre-enter Showmanship classes online by the published Junior Department entry deadline. Showmanship age will be the exhibitors age as of August 7, 2025.
- 13. All milking age cows are eligible for the Best Udder class in their division. Exhibitors must enter this class by the online registration deadline. There is no entry fee for these classes.

Special Awards

Supreme Champion Heifer and Female Over All Breeds: An award will be given by the Illinois State Fair to the exhibitor of the Supreme Champion Heifer and Supreme Champion Female of the Junior Show at the 2025 Illinois State Fair. An award will also be given by the Illinois State Fair to the exhibitor of the Supreme Champion Land of Lincoln Heifer and Female of the Junior Show at the 2025 Illinois State Fair. Additionally, the exhibitor of the Land of Lincoln Supreme Champion Female will be the recipient of the proceeds from the sale of a Bonnie Mohr print at the livestock auction of the 2026 Governor's Sale of Champions.

<u>Breed Awards:</u> The following awards will be given in each class: Junior Champion & Reserve Champion Female, Senior Champion & Reserve Champion Female, Grand Champion & Reserve Grand Champion Female.

<u>Best Udder Classes:</u> The top two (2) Best Uddered animals from milking classes will be recognized with ribbons in both junior and Land of Lincoln classes.
